



Krohn Clinic Update on COVID-19 Vaccination for People 65 and Older

Krohn Clinic has received hundreds of requests for the COVID-19 vaccinations since the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) announced that adults over the age of 65 will be eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine beginning January 25.

We appreciate that so many people are seeking this vaccination to protect themselves, their loved ones and community members. We are working as quickly as possible to ensure those who are eligible receive vaccinations. We urge patience as we navigate the high number of people reaching out to schedule a vaccination and as we await supplies of the vaccine.

There are approximately 700,000 Wisconsinites who are 65 and older and Wisconsin currently receives around 70,000 first-dose vaccines per week from the federal government. It will take time to vaccinate this population in Wisconsin. Krohn Clinic, like all health systems and clinics, is reliant on state and federal health departments to disperse vaccines. Without increased amounts of vaccines, elderly patients may have to wait weeks, if not months, to receive the vaccination.
